Adult Protective Service

Protect vulnerable adults from financial, physical abuse, neglect, and exploitation. Make a report by phone or online (<u>https://des.az.gov/reporting-arizona-adult-abuse-neglect-and-exploitation</u>). Legal and home-based services can be facilitated with police, lawyers, courts, and community agencies. The goal is to assist individuals to remain in their homes.

ALTCS – Arizona Long Term Care Services www.azachcccs.gov

This program is for 65+, blind, disabled and/or individuals who live in nursing homes or require care at a nursing home level. The application process requires an interview, meeting eligibility requirements which can take up to 45 days. Thereafter, services are available at nursing homes, assisted living homes, in-home health care, hospice, attendant care at home, delivered meals, adult day care and case management. Apply at local AHCCCS offices which can be found by calling 602 417-6600.

Domestic Violence Does Not Respect Age. Abuse is **PHYSICAL**, **SEXUAL**, **PSYCHOLOGICAL**, **FINANCIAL**, **NEGLECT AND SELF-NEGLECT**. **IT IS ABOUT POWER AND CONTROL**, **NOT LOVE**. With a phone call, safety can be provided by free shelters especially for 50+ adults up to 2 weeks. The time can be extended up to 2 years based on needs. Additionally, case management, support groups, crisis intervention, food and clothing, transportation, job readiness, SSI and SSD applications assistance can be provided.
